1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Prospectus for admission to Post Graduation in Super Specialty Courses in the academic year 2025 which has been approved by the Government of Kerala is published herewith. This contains general information and rules relating to admission to medical post graduate super specialty courses for the academic year 2025-2026 and other related information. Candidates are requested to go through the prospectus carefully and acquaint themselves with the information given. Candidates are also requested to visit the official website of National Board of Examination, New Delhi <http://www.nbe.edu.in> and Director of Medical Education (DME) Kerala www.dme.kerala.gov.in regularly for notifications, updates and announcements.

- 1.2 The prospectus issued in earlier years for the course is not valid for the year 2025. This prospectus sets out the rules and regulations for selection and admission to Post Graduation in Super Specialty courses conducted in Six Government Medical Colleges, Regional Cancer Center Thiruvananthapuram, Malabar Cancer Centre, Thalassery and in self financing private medical colleges within the state of Kerala. The candidates are requested to get themselves informed about the recognition/permited status of the courses through the MCI website before they go for allotment. The allotment will be made by Director General of Health Services Government of India New Delhi in the order of merit in NEET PGSS-2025 as published by NBE, New Delhi.

3. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Candidates are also requested to visit the official websites of National Board of Examination, New Delhi <http://www.nbe.edu.in> regarding NEET PGSS-2025 for eligibility and allotment/admission details.

4. DURATION OF THE COURSE

- 4.1 Duration of the course shall be 3 years from the date of commencement of the course.
- 4.2 All candidates shall complete 3 years from their date of joining the course
- 4.3 The date of commencement of the course will be decided by Govt. of India/National Medical Commission/Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- 4.4 All candidates are required to obtain a minimum of 80% attendance each year before to the next year
- 4.5 Extension for the leave taken in a year may be done in the same year itself.
- 4.6 Final attendance will be calculated taking the average for the three years.

5. SELECTION & ALLOTMENT

- 5.1 The selection of the candidate will be made on merit through an Entrance Examination conducted by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi.
- 5.2 The Director General of Health Services, New Delhi will prepare the rank list of the candidate who has qualified for the NEET PGSS-2025 and will do the allotment for the candidates as per the rank under All India Merit.

7. RANK LIST & SELECTION

The selection of candidates to the course will be on the basis of the rank obtained in the Entrance Examination for PG Super Specialty Courses 2025 conducted by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi.

8. How and when to apply:

[As per order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, New Delhi in WP (C) No:267/2017 Dated:09/05/2017, All India Quota seats in Government Medical Colleges and Private/Self-Financing Medical Colleges shall be conducted by the DGHS, New Delhi and as per the letter No:F.No.U-12021/18/2017-MEC(Part)dated:18/05/2017 from Ministry of Health & Family Welfare Department, Government of India -New Delhi, DGHS has been entrusted to conduct common counseling for all the Post Graduate Super Specialty seats of Government as well as Private/Self-Financing Medical Colleges]

9. ALLOTMENT

9.1 General

9.1.1 The allotment to the courses will be made through counseling DGHS, New Delhi. No individual communication will be served for the candidates for appearing the counseling from this office.

9.1.2 The candidate has to report to the college in which he/she is allotted on the date fixed by the "MCI/DGHS/Hon'ble Supreme Court of India". No extension of time for reporting to the college will be granted under any circumstances. The candidates who get selection will have to remit the fees applicable to the course to which they are allotted, at the time of admission in the concerned Medical College/institution.

9.1.3 No transfer or change of college will be allowed after the closing of admission. Transfers before closing of admission will be done only through counseling by DGHS, New Delhi.

9.2 *Documents in original to be produced at the time of Admission*

- (i) M.B.B.S. Degree Certificate.
- (ii) Post Graduate Degree / Dip. NB Certificate*.

*Candidates who have appeared or are appearing for the MD/MS/Dip. NB Examination should produce the original PG Degree Certificates at the time of admission.

- (iii) Certificate to prove age.
- (iv) Any other Certificate required along with the application.

9.3 Additional Documents in original to be produced at the time of Admission

- 1) Admit Card issued by the National Board of Examination, New Delhi.**
- 2) Allotment memo issued by DGHS, New Delhi.**
- 3) Document to prove date of birth.**
- 4) Permanent Registration Certificate from T.C. Medical Council.**
- 5) CRRI Certificate.**
- 6) Certificate of Eligibility/Equivalency certificate from KUHS for candidates who have passed the qualifying examination (MD/MS/DNB Degree) from Universities outside Kerala.**
- 7) Required bonds duly filled up and signed by candidates and sureties.**
- 8) Any other documents mentioned in the allotment notification.**
- 9) Transfer certificate from the college last studied**

Note: “Originals of all the documents will have to be produced before the admitting authority as and when demanded”

9.4 A candidate leaving one course to join another of his/her higher option, during the validity period of the Rank List shall not be liable to pay the Liquidated damages, and is eligible for refund of Tuition fee & Caution Deposit/ remitted for the course.

10. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES &EXECUTION OF BOND

10.1 The applicants selected for the Super Specialty Courses have to execute two bonds as in clause 10.1.1 and 10.1.2 shown below in stamped paper (all pages of the bond should be in stamped paper) of the total value of Rs.200 of Kerala Stamp paper each at the time of joining the course.

10.1.1 He / she shall not discontinue the Super Specialty Course he / she has been allotted to after the validity period of the Rank List of NEET PG SS-2025. If a student discontinues the Super Specialty Courses after the validity period of the rank list, he / she shall pay Rs. 2Crores (Rs.Two crores only) as Liquidated damages and also the stipend/salary already received.

10.1.2 All candidates admitted to Government Medical Colleges will serve the Government of Kerala in Kerala in Health Service/Medical Education Service for a period not less than **One Year** continuously after the completion of the course. This total service rendered by him/her shall not be inclusive of obligations of compulsory bond for specialty and super-specialty courses done in Government Medical Colleges of Kerala (i.e., there shall be separate obligations of one year for both). The facility of relieving will not be made available for observer ship or any other courses. The service in Central or any other State Government or other Public Sector Undertakings (except Defense Service) will not count for relaxation of the compulsory services. They shall be relieved after completing the prescribed period of service as stated above and producing certificate of completion of bond(s) as the case may be and such service should be done without any break immediately after the course. The Principals of the Colleges where they complete the courses shall retain the certificates till such time as proof of the satisfactory completion of the courses given by the competent authorities i.e., DMO/Principal of the college where bond posting is given as the case may be.

“All students of Regional Cancer Center-Thiruvananthapuram shall do compulsory service of not less than 1 year after their Post Graduate course in Regional Cancer Center/MCC or Respective Department of a Government Medical College (For further details regarding compulsory service please refer to the website of RCC-Thiruvananthapuram (<http://www.rcctvm.org>).”

“The bonded obligation of Malabar Cancer Centre, Thalassery (MCC) will be in accordance with the conditions stipulated in GO (Rt) No. 2950/2022/H&FWD dated 15.12.2022 & GO (Rt) No. 209/2026/H&FWD dated 15.01.2026. (For further details regarding compulsory service please refer to the website of MCC- Thalassery (<https://www.mcc.kerala.gov.in>)”

“The conditions of bonded obligation of Private Medical Colleges have to be fixed at Government Level”.

10.1.3 This compulsory service shall be continuous and shall be waived only for service of the Government of Kerala through Kerala Public Service Commission. In the event of getting a regular post under Government of Kerala, quitting or relinquishment of the new post permitted by the Head of the Institution only after completing the remaining compulsory service, failing which liquidated damages shall be paid. If anyone violates this condition, it will be construed as professional misconduct and the fact reported to the T. C. Medical Council for suitable action including cancellation of registration by the Council. A penalty of Rs. 2 Crores (Rs. Two Crores only) will also be levied.

10.2 No Admission shall be valid without getting the bond as detailed above executed at the time of joining or within 7 days from the date of admission at the discretion of the Principal. Any lapse in this regard will be treated as the liability of the Principal concerned. After 7 days the admission is liable to be cancelled. Candidates getting admission in the final allotment will have to execute the bond within 7 days. Otherwise

their admission shall be cancelled and they are bound to pay the liquidated damages as mentioned in clause 10.1.1 The original certificates after due verification will be kept in the safe custody of the Principal/DMO of health Services concerned till the completion of the bond. **The candidates will not be eligible for stipend/salary until the execution of bonds.** Format of Bond available in the office of Principal of the Medical College concerned only will be accepted. A copy of the same is also Annexed as I & II.

- 10.2.1 The parents/guardians shall stand as sureties for the candidates. The signatures of the candidate and the sureties have to be attested by a Gazetted officer of State/Central Government or Grama/Block/ District/ Panchayath President/Municipal Chairperson/Mayor or MLA/MP, by countersigning in the bond agreement as a witness.
- 10.3 If Govt. is not in a position to offer job either under Medical Education Services or Health Services to fulfill the Compulsory Government Service as per the bonded obligation within one year after completion of the course, the candidates will be absolved of the bonded obligation. Government has power to use their services (if required) through recruitment boards (e.g. KPSC) or by direct recruitment on contract basis whichever is deemed fit as per the circumstances prevailing at the time.
- 10.4. No admission to Government Medical College shall be made without getting the Bonds as prescribed in Annexure I & II of the prospectus at the time of joining. No stipend shall be paid to the candidate who does not execute the bond. Format of bond will be available in the office of Principal of the Medical College concerned. Bonds furnished in another format will not be accepted. Any lapse in this regard will be treated as the personal liability of the Principal concerned.
- 10.5 The certificates which are to be submitted in the colleges at the time of admission will be released only after the completion of compulsory bonded service or in the case of bond violation, the liquidated damages are paid. If the bonded candidate gets a regular posting under Government of Kerala through Kerala Public Service Commission the certificates will be handed over to the Head of that service till the compulsory bond period is served.
- 10.6 Governments have power to use their services (if required) through recruitment boards (e.g. KPSC) or by direct recruitment on contract basis whichever is deemed fit as per the circumstances prevailing at the time.
- 10.7 The Postgraduate Students should have a minimum percentage of attendance as stipulated by the Universities. **All the 365 days of the year are working days for post graduate students. However, they will be permitted to avail casual leave for 20 days, but not more than 7 days including holidays at a stretch. Any other leave will entail extension of the course.** Those who take leave without prior sanction are liable to be considered to be on unauthorized absence. **If the Postgraduate Student is**

unauthorized absent for more than 10 days, he / she will be terminated from the course and liquidated damages will be levied.

10.8 All PG students are eligible for weekly off for one day. This will be allowed by the Head of the Department concerned without affecting the routine functioning of the Department. Weekly off cannot be accumulated.

11 **Female post graduate super specialty students are entitled to avail stipend during maternity leave and its extension only once during the entire course of study including bonded service.**

12 CMEs, workshops and other academic programs conducted by recognized academic bodies are essential aspects of PG training program. All PG students may be permitted to attend such programs without affecting the routine working of the Departments concerned. The Heads of Departments shall sanction special casual leave to PG students subject to a maximum of 15 days per year provided they apply prior to the CME program and the Head of Department is convinced about the genuineness of the program and utility for the particular course. The student on returning from the program should submit attendance certificate to the Head of the Department.

13 No Post Graduate student shall leave the country without prior sanction of the Director of Medical Education. Any violation will be viewed seriously warranting termination of the candidate from the course.

14 All leave (other than eligible leave and maternity leave) exceeding 30 days shall be granted by DME as the case may be.

15. PREVENTIVE MEASURES AGAINST RAGGING

According to the Kerala prohibition of Ragging Act 1998, ragging means doing of any act by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm raising apprehension or shame or embarrassment to / that student and includes testing or abusing or playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students or asking a student to do any act or to perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course be willing to do.

All institutions will have to abide by the directives of the Honorable Supreme Court of India, Dated: 16/05/2007 in SLPNo(S)24295/2006 University of Kerala Vs Council, Principal's, colleges, Kerala and ors (with SLP(C)No. 24296.99/2004 and W.P (Crl) No.173/2006 and SLP(C) No.14356/2005) and the recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India on effective prevention of ragging in educational institutions.

In case, the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he / she indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he / she shall be expelled from the educational institution. It shall

be collective responsibility of the authority of the institution to see to it that effective steps for preventing ragging are taken Anti-ragging committee and anti ragging squads will have to be formed to take effective measures against ragging and they should adhere to the stipulations and effectively monitor and comply with the directives each of the students of the institution and his/her parents, or guardian are required to submit a combined undertaking at the time of registration/admission in prescribed format available in AnnexureIII which is mandatory for the registration/admission.

16. GENERAL

Not with standing anything contained in the Prospectus, the Government may at any time of their own accord or otherwise, revise or amend any order passed by the subordinate authority.

(Rupees.....only) if the bounden discontinues the course after the validity period of the rank list. This decision of the Secretary to Government of Kerala, Health and Family Welfare Department as to the commission of a breach or as to any indiscipline or misconduct on the part of the Bounden as also the amount of compensation payable and as to whether the Bounden has or has not performed and observed the conditions and bonds under these presents shall be final and binding on the Bounden and the sureties.
